
# Hate Crime is not acceptable

### What is hate crime?



A hate crime is any crime against someone because of:

Their disability or learning difficulty



Their race or the colour of their skin



Their religion or beliefs




 Their choice to say they are male or female or something else



 Their sexuality - gay or straight or something else



Almost any type of crime can be a hate crime.



Hate crimes can include:

 Doing or saying things to hurt someone



Damaging property



Graffiti



Setting fire to something on purpose



Hate crime can also happen online - like on Facebook or Twitter.



Being different is not a crime.




But if someone commits a crime against you because you are different, that is a hate crime.



# People who have suffered a hate crime

People who have suffered a hate crime can feel upset, hurt or confused.



They can get support to help them deal with the situation.

# Don't ignore it - report it



If no one stops hate crime, it can get worse and affect more people.



If you report a hate crime, the police can do something about it.



The police take hate crime seriously. They will look into it fully.



### **Confidential**

No information will be shared without your agreement.



You will be treated with respect.



### **Punishment**

If someone commits a crime which is also a hate crime, they will get a bigger punishment.



### **Support**

In Hertfordshire, we have specially trained hate crime officers.



They give support to anyone who has been a victim of hate crime.
